Amherst Health Department Survey of the Fort River Neighborhood November 2015



ABOUT THIS SURVEY PROJECT

December 2015

The neighborhood near Fort River Elementary School in Amherst is home to two apartment complexes: Watson Farms and Colonial Village. Healthy Hampshire (a regional public health initiative) partnered with the Health Department, the Conservation Department and the Amherst Regional Public Schools Family Center in summer 2015 to conduct a survey of residents in these complexes to gain a better understanding of how to meet their needs around three priorities:

- 1) Where people get their food
- 2) Their knowledge and use of community facilities in Amherst, such as the pools
- 3) Their interest in utilizing the Fort River Farm as a place for recreation and gardening

With a grant from the Office of the Attorney General, the Amherst Health Department worked with Amherst Regional Public Schools Family Center to hire a group of local teens to work on a variety of projects over the summer of 2015 related to healthy food and gardening. One of the projects included being trained in survey techniques and then actually going door to door in these two apartment complexes asking people to take the survey.

The survey was offered in English and Spanish, and several of the youth surveyors were able to verbally administer it in Spanish if requested. 45 people responded to the survey.

The data will be used by the Town of Amherst in policy decisions and planning of capital projects that impact access to healthy food and fitness opportunities.








DEMOGRAPHICS

- Forty-five survey respondents provided demographic information for themselves.
- Respondents were fairly evenly divided among four major age groups: 18-24, 25-34, 35-49, and 50 and over.
- 60% percent of survey respondents were male and 40% were female.
- While respondents sometimes identified themselves with more specific ethnicity categories, approximately 30% identified as Salvadoran and/or Latino. The other major ethnic groups represented were white (24%), Asian (24%) and African-American (16%).







WHERE DO YOU GET YOUR FOOD, AND HOW DO YOU GET THERE?

Over 70% of survey respondents reported that they get groceries at Stop and Shop (most of them mentioned other stores as well). Other frequently-mentioned stores included:

- Big Y (50%)
- Wal-Mart (41%)
- Aldi (34%)
- Trader Joe's and Whole Foods (25% each).


The seven people who mentioned other sources of groceries listed:

- Local farms (3)
- Convenience stores (2)
- Dining hall (1)
- Own garden (1)



A majority of survey respondents reported that they use their own car to get their food, with a substantial minority reporting taking the bus. A few reported that they use someone else's car, and only three respondents reported walking or biking to get food.

Most (81%) of the respondents who reported using their own car did not report using any other means of transportation to get food. However, 35% of the respondents who use the bus also reported at least one other means of transportation.




The Farmer's Market

Just under 30% of respondents reported that they go to the farmer's market in Amherst on Sundays. Of those who reported a reason why they do not go, many (44%) said that they were not interested in going. Nearly 20% reported that they do not know where the market is, and 15% each reported that the market is too expensive and/or they don't know its hours of operation. Only one person


reported that a lack of transportation prevents her or him from going to the market.

Three people listed other reasons why they don't attend: one didn't know about it, one reported preferring to buy everything at one store, and one would like to go but has been traveling frequently.




RECREATION: SWIMMING POOLS

Over 80% of survey respondents reported that they do not use either of the public swimming pools in Amherst. Four respondents each reported using the Mill River Recreation Area pool and the War Memorial pool in front of the high school (each reported using only one of the pools.)



Thirty-six people gave reasons why they did not go to either of the pools. The most common answer, cited by eight respondents, is that the pools are not conveniently located. Seven people each reported that they are not interested in the pools and/or they don't know about them. Six people reported that they do not know how to swim, and four reported that the pools cost too much. Only one person reported that she or he had no transportation to get to the pools.





FORT RIVER FARM

Of 46 respondents, only three reported having their own garden or access to another garden somewhere else. About two-thirds of respondents reported that they would be interested in gardening at Fort River Farm. Of 30 people who indicated which activities at the farm would interest them, 25 (83%) would be interested in harvesting food, 13 (43%) would be willing to help run the garden, 11 (37%) would be interested in preparing the soil and planting seeds, and 7 (23%) would be interested in weeding and upkeep.

Of 30 people who noted that they would need help with gardening, 17 (57%) reported that they would need education about gardening, and 16 (53%) reported that they would need tools. Twelve respondents (40%) would need friends and family members to garden with them.








Only 13 survey respondents (31%) reported that they are a parent or guardian to a child under the age of 18. Eight of those 13 respondents (62%) reported that they would be interested in growing food with their children, and seven of them (54%) said that they would be interested in volunteering at the site to help maintain the garden or trail with their children. Four (31%) reported that they would be interested in using the nature trail with their children. Only one respondent with children would not be interested in any of these activities.


When asked to choose from a list of the best ways to get family and friends excited about using the Fort River Conservation Area, the most popular response (noted by 62% of respondents) was to offer social events such as picnics or barbecues at the site. This was followed by offering tours of the site (41% of respondents) and offering educational events about gardening at the site (24%). Six people suggested other ways to get friends and family excited, including:

- Advertising the low cost of farming
- Field trips
- Showing friends
- Social media meet-ups
- Mail
- Visiting

We also asked what the best ways would be to spread the word about Fort River Farm. The most popular responses were by advertisements (flyers, posters, etc) and using social media, with about one-third of respondents selecting each category. E-mail was also a frequent suggestion.

Thirty-four of 40 respondents (85%) suggested that offering tours in Spanish would be helpful. Other frequently-cited languages included Chinese (23%), Korean (13%), and Portuguese (10%).
